The Library can assist with sourcing titles from the approved age appropriate lists.

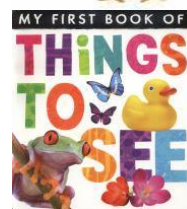
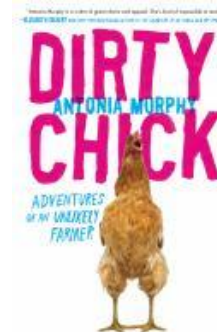
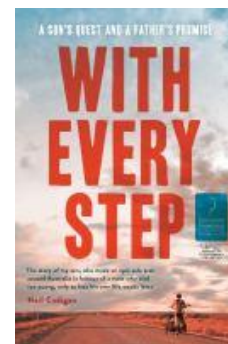
Your Tutor coming soon to the library
